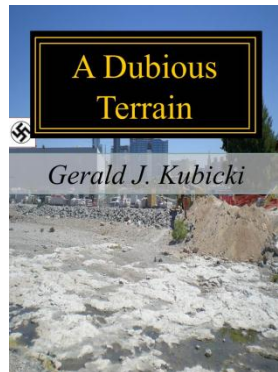


Does White Supremacy Still Exist?

Gerald J. Kubicki's Novel, "A Dubious Terrain," Uses Fiction to Address an Important Issue



As race relations rock the headlines, Americans are beginning to question whether or not white supremacy still exists. Gerald J. Kubicki's thrilling page-turner, *A Dubious Terrain*, the fourth installment in the Dubious Mystery series offers some fictional insight into this very real problem.

In Kubicki's novel, a fictional white supremacist organization known as the Effort is started by the German Nazis in the early 1930's and then spends decades infiltrating American society. They are sent to study at Harvard University with the goal of developing contacts with the rich and powerful in America.

The long-term goal is well-plotted and methodically executed; "The planners believed that Germany was too small to dominate the world, but America, with all its resources, could become the eventual head of the Third Reich." The members of the Effort hold dominant positions in the media, entertainment industry, manufacturing, weapons and ammunition industry, and one member of the Effort has recently ascended into a powerful position as the Director of Homeland Security, making it "the muscle behind the movement."

Although Kubicki's book is fictional, he asks his readers, "Who knows if this didn't really happen?" Kubicki offers more than just a riveting plot, he interweaves relevant, timely themes that resonate with audiences, tackling a variety of issues that range from illegal immigrants to political corruption to the power of Homeland Security. Readers will inevitably be left anxious for the next two installments in the Dubious Mystery series: *A Dubious Plan* and *A Dubious Artifact*.
